



Pupil Premium 2017-18

Background

The Pupil premium is allocated to children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months, and children of service personnel. In 2014 this also included pupils eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years (known as the Ever 6 FSM measure).

Schools are free to spend the pupil premium as they see fit. However, we are held accountable for how we have used the additional funding to support pupils from low-income families. We are required to publish information about how we have used the premium. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils covered by the premium and the extra support they receive.

Our School

In 2017-18 Eastcombe Primary School will receive an estimated total of **£1620** Pupil Premium Funding. 3% of our pupils are meet the criteria. Our school aims that every child achieves their best from their own starting point.
